**OCTOBER 21, 2007 TEACHING: THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE NAME**



*Jesus comes from the Hebrew for "God saves."* The Church teaches that God was not content only to save the Hebrews from literal slavery or domination by another nation. He also wanted to save them from their sins. His Son's death atoned for the sins of mankind. The Catholic Church teaches that men must be

aware of their need for salvation and must call on their Redeemer. The name of Jesus is at the heart of all Catholic prayer.

The title *Christ* is the Greek equivalent of the Hebrew *Messiah*, the "anointed one." In Israel, those consecrated to God - including kings, priests, and prophets - were anointed with oil. Jesus was all three: the King of Kings, a priest, and a of the New Kingdom. Many Jews hoped that Jesus was the long-promised Messiah who would free them from literal, or political, bondage, but Christ's kingdom was not a temporal one. As Jesus said to Peter, "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28).

Jesus was also known by the title Lord, in recognition of his divine power. The Church teaches that Jesus became a man to save men by reconciling them with God, so that men might know God's love, and also to be a model of holiness. Through imitating Christ and getting close to him, men could also partake in the divine nature. God's taking of a human form is known as the Incarnation.
